performances but also a vibrant space for direct dialogue with local residents, youth, activists, minority representatives, and experts. This European perspective deepened Multitude's role as a platform for exchange and allowed Seine-Saint-Denis to connect its local intercultural initiatives with similar experiences across Europe.

As part of the SoD network, the host of the Multitude Festival demonstrated how cultural events can transcend artistic celebration to become arenas of social innovation, contributing to EU-wide discussions on diversity and inclusion. The SoD presence amplified the festival's impact, positioning it as both a celebration of cultural richness and a concrete step toward building a more inclusive European public sphere.

For the SoD participants—representing local authorities from across Europe—attending Multitude offered an invaluable opportunity to experience firsthand how a territory like Seine-Saint-Denis lives and promotes interculturality on a daily basis. 

4. Main take aways/ findings from the event

From the host's perspective: "Through our commitments in terms of international and European policy with the County Council of Seine-Saint-Deni, the SoD project was a true opportunity. Indeed, the Seine-Saint-Denis is a territory with more than a hundred nationalities, where cultures from all around the world come together, and shape a dynamic and singular identity. We wanted to celebrate that with Multitude and reaffirm a unique

model of cohabitation and intercultural exchange. We decided to build a European Pavilion (Sound of Diversity Stage) in the festival area, a place where we organised workshops and meetings with our European partners. We also invited partners from the The Intercultural Cities Programme (ICC) program and WELDI. This pavilion was supposed to be a space for dialogue, but also a showcase for a different kind of Europe: a vibrant, inclusive Europe, one that is built locally, in our cities, departments, and neighborhoods. The SoD project was a good occasion to compare our good practice in terms of inclusion and diversity with our partners.

"The substantive part of the event was really great. Both the meeting and the workshops were well prepared and had a rich content. The festival itself was all what this project is about!"

"The festival was amazing (...). I never visited before and it really represented diversity. There were supernice performances, art and musicians', I appreciated the open and inclusive atmosphere, the quality of the workshops and the opportunity to connect with professionals from across Europe".

"On the positive side, the event brought together a diverse group of participants and organizations, offering valuable perspectives from different countries and contexts. It was a reminder of the importance of international collaboration and the potential impact of shared experiences and knowledge".


